Al Reese was a Superstar in the Santa Barbara community.

For over 40 years, he graced many local venues and events, swooning his live music to thousands of friends, colleague's and fans. He traveled the world performing throughout Europe and Asia. He played for local celebrities Rob Lowe and Oprah. He was also a mainstay for the annual Fiesta Spanish Days.

His daughter, Rachelle Chillous, remembered her dad as a die-hard Lakers fan; he played basketball at the YMCA and also boxed and jogged. He never smoked, drank or did drugs. Al was a familiar face as both a guest and singing the National Anthem at Santa Barbara Islander (Los Angeles Lakers minor league team) basketball games in 1990 and the Santa Barbara Breakers basketball games in the mid 2000's. He also entertained audiences at the Fess Parker Hotel for our Santa Barbara Basketball Court of Champions Ceremonies.
